

Thank you for your interest in the English Department's M.F.A. Creative Writing Program at Colorado State University! Below you will find information regarding the program's application process, and hopefully the answers to any questions you might have.

MFA program's application deadline is January 1st. The MFA program does not admit for the Spring semester. The "Areas of Study" for the program are Fiction, Creative Nonfiction, and Poetry.

Applications

To apply for the MFA Graduate Program, click on this link to access the Graduate School <u>Application Portal</u>. The deadline for all required application documents is January 1st for the following academic year. If you intend to apply for a Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA) as well, you must complete and upload the **separate** application to your profile by **January 1st**.

The Program application documents needed to complete your application are:

- Your Resume or CV
- Your Statement of Purpose: Double-spaced, two pages; introduce yourself and state your goals while in this graduate program. Upload this form online.
- Your writing sample: Details below. Upload this form online.
- **English Proficiency Test Score:** click <u>HERE</u> for accepted tests and scores.
- **Optional:** The optional GTA application.
- Two letters of recommendation. Online, provide the e-address of each recommender who has agreed to write a letter. Your recommenders will be e-mailed instructions to upload their letters.
- **Transcripts:** These must be from each university or college you attended that represent the course work you completed for your bachelor's degree and any advanced degrees since then. Unofficial transcripts are accepted for application review. To send official transcripts, ask each institution to send hard copies directly to this address:

M.F.A. in Creative Writing Application Tips:

Select as your program choice: Creative Writing (M.F.A.). A prompt asks for area of study (text box); please select from either Creative Nonfiction, Fiction, or Poetry; please enter only one of these options.

Your program writing sample:

Use 12-pt. font, either Times New Roman or Arial

If you are applying to Fiction:

- * 12-20 pages of poems
- Add a footer to include your name and number the pages
- * Submit literary fiction: One or two short stories, or one or two chapters of a novel, not to exceed 25 pages. Put the title and your

name on the first page, above the start of your story or novel

- 12-pt. font, either Times New Roman or Arial

If you are applying to Creative Nonfiction:

- Use double line spacing

- Add header or footer to include your name and number the pages
- Start each short story or novel chapter on a new page
- * Submit literary nonfiction: two essays (personal, lyric, etc.); or two
 - * Use 12-pt. font (Times Roman or Arial), double-spaced, pages numbered, name and title on the first page of each Start each essay or chapter on a new page

GTA Application Instructions: Prepare all three parts of your GTA application as one document, to appear in this

1. **The Background Experience form**—this is a fillable form to complete and save to your computer until ready to upload entire GTA application.

2. Your Statement of Teaching Interest—opportunity to express your interest in composition pedagogy and practice, to discuss your teaching-related training and/or experi-

- ence. 3. Your Statement on Learning & Writing—a short 500-700 word essay focusing on your response to one of the given topics on the application.
- Our GTAs teach three sections of CO150 College Composition each year, primarily to freshmen and sophomores. Being awarded a GTAship would provide paid tuition (1st year, in-state and non-resident tuition; 2nd year, in-state tuition cost only) as well as a
